

Trafficking in Persons Certification and Compliance Plan

Certification Regarding Trafficking in Persons, Implementing Title XVII of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2013 Applies to the applicant & recipient

> A certification regarding Trafficking in Persons must be completed prior to receiving an award if the estimated value of services required under the award outside the United States exceeds \$500,000. This certificate must also be submitted annually to the Agreement Officer during the term of the award.

The applicant /recipient must implement procedures to prevent any activities described in section (a) of the Mandatory Provision "Trafficking in Persons" The applicant /recipient must monitor, detect, and terminate any contractor, subawardee, employee or agent engaged in Trafficking in Persons

or agent The applicant /recipient must implement a compliance plan to prevent the activities described in section (a) of the Mandatory Provision "Trafficking in Persons"

An awareness program for employees

A recruitment and wage plan

A reporting process for employees

A housing plan with safety standard

If the Recipient receives any credible information regarding a violation, the recipient must immediately notify the cognizant Agreement Officer and the USAID Office of Inspector General at ig.hotline@usaid.gov; and must fully cooperate with any Federal agencies responsible for audits.
