AZERBAIJAN: GENERATING MOMENTUM FOR PRIVATE SECTOR PARTNERSHIPS

Through <u>Local Works</u>, USAID/Azerbaijan is looking to strengthen partnerships with the government, civil society, and the private sector (focusing on business and professional associations) to achieve shared economic goals. In looking for creative ways to engage with these new partners, the Mission decided to host a "Partnership Summit" last month. The event featured networking opportunities for more than 160 attendees, laying the groundwork for future collaboration. The Mission's active participation in the Summit confirmed to participants its role as both a collaborative partner and donor.



ETHIOPIA: EXPANDING RURAL ELECTRICITY FOR MAJI

Under the <u>Cooperative Development Program</u> (CDP), National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) International is working with the Maji Development Coalition and community members to form an electric cooperative in Maji, an area in Southwestern Ethiopia. After the community voted to establish the Maji Clean Energy Cooperative last year, more than 1,000 residents – nearly one-third female – indicated interest in joining. Now, NRECA is helping the cooperative draft a business plan and establish governance structures. Knowing that developing a self-reliant, financially stable cooperative takes patience and commitment, NRECA is also initiating awareness campaigns throughout Maji. Once fully established, the cooperative will provide affordable and reliable power to more than 17,000 households. Watch the work in action.

Uganda: Making Use of Overabundant Avocados

In Uganda, a Peace Corps Volunteer and a local Ugandan organization started a Small Project Assistance (SPA) project to increase farmers' incomes through avocado oil production. In many parts of the country, there is an avocado tree in almost every home, but avocados are so abundant during harvest seasons that much is wasted and the markets are flooded with the fruit. The SPA project taught local farmers how to make and market avocado oil, and how to use the avocado peels as an alternative biofuel. While the official SPA project has ended, the farmers who participated continue to create and sell avocado oil.

Stopping As Success: Refining Tools for Development Practitioners

Stopping As Success (SAS), an E3/LS cocreated research initiative, convened a closeout event to discuss lessons learned, collect feedback on tools and resources, and outline next steps for its findings. With participation from local and national organizations, donors, and civil society, the event helped the SAS consortium further refine their resources - from consolidating information (with a book forthcoming), to suggestions for additional online resources. Philippines: Growing Rural Cooperatives

In January, USAID/Philippines launched Generating Rural Opportunities by Working with Cooperatives (GROW-Coop), a Local Works activity to build capacity in agriculture cooperatives. By employing a "big sister" approach, GROW-Coop connects smaller agriculture cooperatives to large, established Filipino cooperatives for mentorship and capacity building. In February, GROW-Coop established an advisory group and co-developed its first-year work plan. With representatives from the national
