



INTEGRATED FIRE MANAGEMENT -TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE



The Latin American and Caribbean (LAC) region is experiencing an increasing number of forest fires, which are affecting people's health and safety and causing the loss of property, livelihoods, and biodiversity.

Since 1998, USAID's Office of U.S. Foreign Disaster Assistance (USAID/OFDA) has provided specialized technical assistance in the LAC region to help countries prepare policies, strategies, and national plans for Integrated Fire Management (IFM). USAID/OFDA also promotes and facilitates the creation of public awareness campaigns and the establishment of early warning systems and provides training to local technical staff and community stakeholders. USAID/OFDA's technical assistance programs aim to help protect the region's most vulnerable populations and strengthen local agencies' responses to forest fires.

USAID/OFDA has trained more than 20,000 forest firefighters and multiple teams of instructors throughout the LAC region. USAID/OFDA also has collaborated in developing reference materials in English, French, and Spanish that help reinforce community preparedness and response capacities.
