AAPDs provide information of significance to all agency personnel and partners involved in the Acquisition and Assistance process. Information includes (but is not limited to): advance notification of changes in acquisition or assistance regulations; reminders; procedures; and general information. Also, AAPDs may be used to implement new requirements on short-notice, pending formal amendment of acquisition or assistance regulations.

AAPDs are **EFFECTIVE AS OF THE ISSUED DATE** unless otherwise noted in the guidance below; the directives remain in effect until this office issues a notice of cancellation.

The purpose of this AAPD is to inform USAID contracting officers and negotiators of the requirements for reporting grants and cooperative agreements awarded by USAID Washington and missions.

The Federal Assistance Award Data (FAADS) is a central collection of selected, computer-based data on Federal financial assistance award transactions. Each record contains such items as the name and location of the recipient, the amount of awarded or amended Federal assistance (usually on the basis of the obligated amount), the program under which the award was made, and a project description. All departments and major agencies of the executive branch of the Federal Government with grant making authority are now reporting to FAADS. The FAADS provides this data quarterly to the Bureau of Census electronically via FTS file transfer. The Bureau of Census consolidates this information with data and prepares summary reports to Congress, the Executive Branch, and other political and private interest groups. The FAADS program is authorized by P.L. 97-326, the consolidated Federal Funds Report Act of 1982.

The SF281 and the SF 279 are the statutory procurement reports that are transmitted to the federal Procurement Data Center (FPDC) quarterly. Because all information will now be captured in ProDoc during award processing, Missions will no longer need to send the SF281 Summary Report for Actions \$25,000 and under to Washington. The Washington database will receive that information when you transmit all of your procurement actions. The SF281 and the SF279 will be compiled, combined with USAID/W actions and reported to FPDC from the Washington database.

ProDoc requires that you complete the SF 281 and the SF 279 when processing each action. In order for a Contracting Officer to approve and sign an action, a system validation must occur insuring that you have completed the Federal Procurement Data Center (FPDC) requirements. Upon completion of each action, the user must run the edit checks to receive the message "ICAROK" for Acquisition actions or ASSTOK for assistance actions to receive final approval. Only those actions deemed "OK" are transmitted/reported to AID/W. USAID/W will compile all of the data and send a single report to FPDC.

FAADS does not distinguish between types of Federal funds (appropriated by Congress, retained revenues, revolving fund revenues, etc.), nor does it distinguish based on the location of the Federal office obligating those funds. It requires that all awards to domestic recipients are reported. "Domestic" assistance refers to awards to US recipients, regardless of the type of funds and the geographic location of the office awarding the assistance.

Grants awarded to non-US recipients are not reported to FAADS. Awards funded with host country funds, such as local currency trust funds, are NOT to be reported, even if they are considered to be part of a "match" requirement under a SOAG. Recipient cost share is also not to be reported.

The information required by the FAADS report includes a CFDA (Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance) Number. We are in discussions with GSA regarding how USAID can register its programs in the CFDA. In the meantime, we have worked with the Census Bureau to develop a list of Pseudo-codes to be used for reporting in FAADS instead of the CFDA number. The Pseudo-code number bases the list of code on the funding source, allowing us to identify the program. For programs with multiple funding sources, use the code reflecting the primary source of funds. Attached to this notice is the list of pseudo codes numbers for the Agency report.
