# **USAID** Response to the Crisis in Venezuela

Since 2014, Venezuela has been experiencing a political and economic crisis-marked by devastating hyperinflation—that has led to severe lack of access to food and critical medicine shortages and left seven million Venezuelans in need of humanitarian aid. USAID is providing immediate humanitarian and long-term development assistance inside Venezuela to meet urgent life-saving needs, stem the spread of infectious diseases, respond to COVID-19, help rebuild the economy and health care system, and support the democratically-elected National Assembly, independent media, and civil society.
