PARAGUAY: FOSTERING SOLIDARITY IN TIMES OF CRISIS

Through Cooperative Development Program (CDP) implementing partner Equal Exchange, the Manduvirá sugarcane cooperative in Paraguay is supporting its members and the local community during this difficult time. At the cooperative's annual (and this year, virtual) meeting, members voted to allocate a portion of the cooperative's fair trade premiums to provide 3,700 food baskets to essential staff, such as the cooperative's drivers and field workers. "I think that being part of a cooperative or having a cooperative nearby is a social strength, because with solidarity as its essence, we cannot be oblivious to members' needs," remarked Alicia, a project manager at the cooperative. Not only is the cooperative protecting and empowering its own members during this crisis, it is also taking steps to ensure the well-being of the greater community. Members are pooling cash donations from their own salaries to provide food, masks, gloves, thermometers, cleaning supplies, and other essential items to households and health clinics in the area. As Alicia noted, "Cooperatives are a key aspect of resilience in these types of situations, since we feel the needs of others are our own, and we can only succeed if we stay together and support each other." PHILIPPINES: COLLECTING DATA TO IMPROVE RESOURCE MANAGEMENT



The Office of Local Sustainability (E3/LS) salutes Peace Corps Volunteers who were evacuated from their posts in March due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In honor of World Oceans Day (June 8), E3/LS is pleased to showcase a completed USAID-Peace Corps Small Project Assistance (SPA) Program project from the Philippines. In the Visayas Islands, a Peace Corps Volunteer worked with the local community to facilitate a coastal environmental profile of coastal habitats and the socioeconomic conditions of local fisherpeople to replace the outdated plan from 20 years prior. By building local capacity to conduct the assessment and creating a data baseline, the SPA project laid the groundwork for sustainable, realistic, and inclusive environmental policies and programs.

UGANDA: CONVENING THE BATWA COMMUNITY

The Batwa, who used to be hunter-gatherers, are the most ancient people in Africa. Reduced

to only about 6,000 individuals, they lost their forest homes to national park development. What does the future hold for the young Batwa in Kisoro, southwest Uganda? To answer that question, USAID/Uganda is supporting local leadership - so that the Batwa themselves can answer that question. USAID/Uganda is providing facilitation and technical assistance to the local leadership to convene Batwa for listening sessions, as in the picture here, and support their work with the community.
